

Outcomes of Researches in 2018

- Findings of Mrs. D. H. S. Komahan and Mr. K. Prasannath from Department of Agricultural Biology, draw attention to the commercial bleach (chlorox®) as a promising new applicant for the control of damping-off in tomato varieties Rajitha, Platinum 701 F1 and K. C. 01.
- The study conducted by P. A. N. P. Pandipperuma, R. F. Niranjana, D. Senevirathne and K. P. G. T. Guruge showed that as the brinjal samples collected at the Batticaloa district was contaminated with pesticides it was not safer for consumer usage whereas okra was safer for usage as it was not contaminated with pesticides.
- The study of S. Karunakaran and R. F. Niranjana stated that the extract of garlic (Allium sativum) and neem (Azadirachta indica) would be effective treatments in controlling the stored insect pest, Tribolium castaneum.
- A study conducted by K. Sumangala, S. Srikrishnah and S. Sutharsan revealed that application of 20% liquid seaweed (Sargassum crassifolium) extract promote the growth and flowering in roses.
